#### REFLECTIONS FROM THE PASTOR

My philosophy professor in undergraduate used to say that philosophy is just asking the question Why. He said we are all philosophers until we reach the age of 5 or 6 when our parents make us stop asking why to everything. Interestingly enough this sentiment has become common place in the school system, don't ask questions just accept what I teach you as truth. It is also common place within the Church universal. We are scolded when we ask why or question something in church. We just do things or say things because that is what we have always done or said.

Every year, when the family gathers for the Seder Meal, it begins with the 4 questions of Why. It starts with "Why is this night different from all others?" The whole focus of the evening is the retelling of the Exodus from Egypt when we were delivered from slavery.

If someone asked you why is Easter different from all other days what would our answer be? People will come to church on Easter Sunday and we never see them again until Christmas. What is so different about this day? Is it the Easter breakfast or going out after church to an Easter brunch? Is it being able to come show off the new outfit you got especially for Easter? What makes this day different than all the others? What is the story we tell about Easter/ resurrection? How do we "train up a child in the way of the Lord and when he/she grows old he/she will not depart from it." We lament that people are baptized and confirmed but then they stop coming. Maybe we have forgotten how to tell the story of deliverance from slavery. Maybe we have forgotten how to tell what resurrection means to us. Every Sunday we come to the Lord's table and participate in the Lord's Supper (notice it is not ours but the Lord's Supper). In the Great Thanksgiving we hear where Jesus says "Do this in Remembrance of me" How do we tell the story of how Christ died for us so that we may never die. How do we live the remembrance of the resurrection and deliverance from slavery?

Has Easter become just a pageant of pomp and circumstance? Let's try something different this year and tell the story of Easter every chance we get so that all may come to know Christ. Maybe we would do well to begin with the question of How is this day different than all the rest?

Plans are beginning for the 59<sup>th</sup> and 60<sup>th</sup> anniversaries. Pastor Pat has ideas for our 59<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Ideas will be presented to the Church Council.

The Holy Week schedule was reviewed. Pastor Pat is putting together the Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services. The Maundy Thursday service will begin at 6:00 p.m. and include a potluck meal, worship with Holy Communion, and Stripping of the Altar. The Good Friday service is being planned and will begin at 6:30 p.m.

Palm Sunday plans are to gather in the narthex and proceed into the sanctuary.

Easter Sunday plans include the Easter breakfast which will be held from 8:45 a.m. until 9:30 - 10:00 a.m. Flowering cross will be prepared beginning at 9:00 a.m. The service of the Resurrection of Our Lord begins sharply at 10:30 a.m.

The meeting closed with Pastor Pat leading the committee in prayer.

The next meeting of the Worship Committee will be held on April 17, 2024, at Bethel at 10:00 a.m.

#### **WORSHIPING IN APRIL**



THE SEASON OF EASTER White/Gold are the colors of Easter.



We have worshiped on Easter morning, enjoyed an Easter breakfast and dinner during the day, the Easter bunny has filled the baskets, the Easter egg hunts were enjoyed by the children, and now its time to rest. All this has been completed and now what? The Easter season begins on

Easter day and continues for fifty days. In the season of Easter, we continue to hear these familiar words as we rejoice in the resurrection of our Lord and Savior: *Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed, Alleluia!* 

**Easter**, also called **Pascha** (Aramaic, Greek, Latin) or **Resurrection Sunday**, is a Christian festival and cultural holiday commemorating the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, described in the New Testament as having occurred on the third day of his burial following his crucifixion by the Romans at Calvary c. 30 AD. It is the culmination of the Passion of Jesus Christ, preceded by Lent (or Great Lent), a 40-day period of fasting, prayer, and penance.

Easter-observing Christians commonly refer to the week before Easter as Holy Week, which in Western Christianity begins on Palm Sunday (marking the entrance of Jesus in Jerusalem), includes Spy Wednesday (on which the betrayal of Jesus is mourned), and contains the days of the Easter Triduum including Maundy Thursday, commemorating the Maundy and Last Supper, as well as Good Friday, commemorating the crucifixion and death of Jesus.<sup>[15]</sup> In Eastern Christianity, the same days and events are commemorated with the names of days all starting with "Holy" or "Holy and Great"; and Easter itself might be called "Great and Holy Pascha", "Easter Sunday", "Pascha" or "Sunday of Pascha". In Western Christianity, Eastertide, or the Easter Season, begins on Easter Sunday and lasts seven weeks, ending with the coming of the 50th day, Pentecost Sunday... Saint Mark the Evangelist also known as John Mark, is traditionally believed to be the author of the Gospel of Mark and a companion of <u>Saint Peter</u>. He accompanied <u>Paul of Tarsus</u> and <u>Barnabas</u> on Paul's first missionary journey. After a sharp dispute, Barnabas separated from Paul, taking Mark to <u>Cyprus</u> (<u>Acts</u> 15:36-40). Later Paul called upon the services of Mark, the kinsman of Barnabas, and Mark was named as Paul's fellow worker. His feast day, April 25, is the anniversary of his martyrdom. His <u>evangelistic</u> symbol is the <u>lion</u>.




#### **GREETINGS FROM THE CHURCH SECRETARY**
